




Gibsonville

Gibsonville did not exist before Joseph Gibson, a local farmer, provided grading services in 1851 for the newly formed North Carolina Rail Road. The first train arrived on October 9, 1855 and the depot was named Gibsonville in his honor. It wasn't until February 18, 1871 that the town was issued a charter by the legislature.

In the late 1890's, Berry Davidson built two textile mills, that transformed Gibsonville from an agricultural shipping station into a small town with an industrial base. When the last mill closed in the 1980's, Gibsonville became a residential community for the Burlington and Greensboro metro area. Today, Gibsonville is "that quaint little town next door" with over 6700 friendly people who favor the simplicity of earlier times.
