Water Quality Preventive Maintenance Program



In a continuing effort to improve water quality, the following water utilities: Archdale, Burlington, Greensboro, High Point, Jamestown, Randleman, Reidsville, and the Piedmont Triad Regional Water Authority will conduct a routine water quality preventative maintenance program beginning on April 14, 2014 and ending May 11, 2014. This process will involve a temporary switch from present chloramines to chlorine in order to optimize water quality in our distribution systems.

As a water purchaser from the City of Burlington, the Town of Gibsonville will also be involved in this program. Please see the enclosed flyer in the April 1st water bill for more information or visit the Town's website at www.Gibsonville.net.

Spring Clean-up

The Town will have a town wide Spring clean-up from April 21, 2014 to May 2, 2014. Let's do our part in cleaning up the town and our yards. Citizens may put out items for town pickup during this time at no charge; excluding brush such as tree trimmings, limbs, etc....

Remember now that Spring has arrived; grass & other vegetation has started growing. The Town has an Ordinance which prohibits grass over twelve inches high.

Household Hazardous Waste Disposal Event and Shred Event

The Town of Gibsonville and Town of Elon will be sponsoring a household hazardous waste disposal (9 am to 11 am) and identity theft prevention shred-it event (9 am to 1 pm). The event is scheduled for Saturday, May 31, 2014 at the Beth Schmidt Park located at 434 Cook Road in Elon. Household hazardous waste items that will be accepted include computers, televisions, and electronics (limit one each per vehicle), batteries, fluorescent tubes, refrigeration and air condition units with freon, propane tanks/gas cylinders, used motor oils, filters, brake fluid, fire extinguishers, paint related materials, solvents, thinners, sealers, varnishes, insecticides and pesticides. To participate in the household hazardous waste disposal event, you will need proof of Elon or Gibsonville residency. You may present your water bill, phoenix card, or intact town newsletter as proof of residency. No commercial/business/contractor waste will be accepted for either event.
