Community Profile

Small Town Between the Raleigh-Durham and Greensboro – High Point Metros:
Bedroom community within a thirty minute drive of 500,000+ persons.

Infrastructure: Access to the combined I-40 / I-85 thoroughfare (116,000+ VPD per NC DOT 2014 traffic counts), near two international airports (Raleigh Durham / RDU & Piedmont Triad International / GSO), the NC Railroad (passenger and freight), and numerous high speed IT options.

Amenities: Over two million sq ft of retail and service providers within five miles.

Quality of Life: Ranked 13th of top 50 Safe Cities in NC (2015), schools ranked above state & national averages, and also within the top 10 most affordable cities to purchase a residence in NC.

Local Investment: Gibsonville is a business friendly city investing in itself. It has significant civic and personal investment from local businesses and residents. Town government has recently invested \$125,000 into economic development projects.
