
Public Safety Day



The Town provides curbside collection of grass clippings and leaves with an automated vacuum truck. In order to utilize and maintain Town equipment properly and maximize service to residents, the Town asks that citizens follow these guidelines to properly dispose of their yard waste:


Town does not pickup after Contractors. Please ensure if using a Contractor to include disposal cost in your agreement. This includes tree trimming, building materials, carpet, etc...

Fats, Oils, & Grease: The Town has a Fats, Oils, & Grease Ordinance. Keep grease out of wash water, put oil and grease in collection containers, do no pour oil and grease down drains.

From The Mayor's Desk

I am pleased to report to you that since the last time that I communicated with you through the town's newsletter, the Auditor's have completed the audit of the Town's financial activities and the Town received a clean report. The Town's financial status is very good. I continue to hear that you do not want an increase in your taxes. I hear you loud and clear and I shall communicate your position to the entire Board, I encourage you to contact the board members directly. During the last several weeks, we have been discussing rezonings at the town meetings and you have been there to let your voices be heard.
